# **SECTION : A Dudhnoi College at a Glance**

Dudhnoi College is the manifestation of the collective dreams of people of the locality and the result of their aspirations and perspirations. The college is located in Dudhnoi, which is now headquarter of the Rabha Hasong Autonomous Council and is 110 km from Assam's capital city Guwahati and 42 km from district headquarter town Goalpara.

The College had a modest beginning with only Pre University (Higher Secondary) Arts classes in 1972. Degree classes of Arts stream started in 1974. Latter on Science and Commerce streams were added in session 1985-86 and 2015-16 respectively. Presently the college has 18 different departments offering both Honours (Major) and General Courses.

The college has a pristine green and serene campus spreading over a vast area of 33.05 acres. A big horse-shoe shaped pond runs around the main building. A foot-bridge over the pond enhances the beauty.

#### Facilities available in the College:

1) College Library: Library facility is available to all students and faculty members. Presently our library has more than 20,000 books covering all subjects including general studies and reference. In addition one can access more than 9000 e-journals and 97,000 e-books through N-List (INFLIBNET). The library has separate spacious reading rooms for students and faculties. It also has internet and Xerox facility. The library is completely digitised and presently working towards building audio-visual learning materials.

The college library is open from 9 am to 4.30 pm in all working days.



- 2) College Computer Centre: The College has a Computer Centre in the department of Computer Science. Apart from this every department has their own computer. Small separate computer lab is available in some departments on the basis of requirement.
- 3) Modern Classrooms and Laboratories: The College has many class rooms equipped with modern audio-visual facility. Well equipped modern laboratory facilities are available in different department for effective teaching-learning.
- 4) College Hostel: The College has separate well equipped hostels for Boys and Girls. Hostel rooms are twin-sharing basis. At present we have 80 seats for Boys and 80 seats for Girls. Each hostel has own mess-hall. Hostels are administered by Superintendents appointed by college authority. The mess is managed by boarders themselves under the supervision of the Superintendent.
- 5) College Play ground: The College has a large outdoor playground. Facilities of all sorts of outdoor games and sports are available. It also has an outdoor basketball court. A pavilion/spectator's gallery covers one side of the field.
- 6) Indoor Stadium: The College has a quite spacious modern indoor stadium with spectators' gallery.
- Boys' and Girls' Common Room: The College has separate Boys' and Girls' common rooms.
- 8) Parking: College has separate parking shades for students and faculties. There is enough space for visitors parking also.
- College Canteen: The College Canteen is managed by Canteen Committee and provides balanced healthy food in reasonable costs.
- 10) Drinking Water: Clean and safe drinking water is available in the College.

One can also opt for MIL Nepali, Hindi and Bengali without any classroom facility, only after obtaining prior permission from college authority.

Elective subject offered in the College: Economics, Economic Geography, Computer Science & Application, Commercial Arithmetic & Elements of Statistics, Mathematics and Statistics.

#### UNDERGRADUATE COURSES UNDER CBCS IN THE COLLEGE

Dudhnoi college has decided to implement Credit Based Choice System (CBCS) as per regulations of the Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System (UGCBCS) Gauhati University, 2019 from the Academic session 2019-2020. The Choice Based Credit System is the logical next step in a credit based semester system which is becoming more learner-centric. A CBCS offers the student a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place, pace and time of learning. The undergraduate degree programme in the CBCS will have courses spread across six- semesters in *Arts, Science* and *Commerce*. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth) shall be 'June to November', and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be 'December to May'. Each student



must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enroll in the Second Academic Session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session. The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years. The maximum time allowed to complete the programme will be six years.

An undergraduate degree program with Honours in a discipline will have a course credit requirement of 148 credits while an undergraduate degree programme without Honours will require a student to earn 132 course credits. Students in a Honours programme can opt to earn additional credits by undertaking additional Elective courses subject to the condition that the total number of course credits does not exceed 160 credits. For a student in a Regular programme, this credit ceiling will be 140 credits. The credits earned beyond the mandatory program requirement will not be taken into consideration in computation of the student's grade but will be recorded in the grade sheet.

#### **OUTLINE OF THE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM COURSES:**

In line with the GU guidelines, the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses and Ability Enhancement courses.

- A. Core Course: A Core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular undergraduate degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.
- B. Elective Course: An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types:
  - I. Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSEC): An Elective Course which is offered by the main discipline. The discipline offering a Discipline Specific Elective course may also offer discipline related elective courses that are interdisciplinary in nature. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to earn 24 course credits from Discipline Specific Elective courses. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours






undergraduate degree programme in science, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 36 credits. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree program in Arts and Commerce, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 24 credits.

**ii.Generic Elective Course:** A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours can acquire 24 course credits from Generic Elective Courses. A Core Course offered in a discipline may be allowed as an Elective to a student from another discipline. This course will be treated under the category of Generic Elective Courses. Generic Elective Courses are not available to students in a non-Honours undergraduate science degree programme while other non-Honours undergraduate programmes require enrollees to take up two such courses.

**iii.Dissertation/Project:** All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.

- **C. Ability Enhancement Courses**: Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree programme will be of two types:
  - **i.Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses**: These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication/ MIL Communication.
  - **ii. Skill Enhancement Courses:** Skill Enhancement Courses will be value- based or skill based and there will be a pool of courses on offer. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the programme requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours undergraduate degree programmes the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits.

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE B.A/B.SC/B.COM HONOURS COURSES UNDER CBCS

A student opting for honours in undergraduate courses shall require to study 14 core papers of the subject concern, each carrying 6 credit. Each Semester1, 2, 5 & 6 has 2 core papers, while Semester 3 & 4 has 3 core papers.

The students shall require to study **2 papers** as **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course** (AECC) in **Sem1 & Sem2** (one paper per semester), each carrying 4 credits. The two compulsory AECC papers are **English/ MIL communication and Environmental Science**. The student has the choice to select one paper for a particular semester.

In addition to 2 core papers and 2 AECC papers, the student shall require to study 4 Generic elective papers, in Sem1, Sem2, Sem3 and Sem4 (one paper in each semester). Each paper carries 6 credits. These papers will be as per the prescribed syllabus of GU.

In Sem3 and Sem 4, the students shall require to study 2 papers of Skill Enhancement Course (one in each semester. Each paper carries 4 credits making a total of 8 credits. Of these 2 papers, the students shall study English as mandatory in the Sem3. The SEC-2 paper will be decided by the department/ college as per the GU syllabus.

In Sem 5 and 6, the student shall required to study 4 papers as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), with 2 papers in each semester. The DSE papers will be according to the syllabus of the GU. Each paper carries 6 credits. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only



The students shall require to study 2 AECC papers, one each in Sem1 & Sem 2, carrying 4 credits in each paper. The student shall required to take English/ MIL communication and Environmental Science as AECC. The student has the choice to select one course for a particular semester.

In Sem 3, Sem 4, Sem 5 and Sem 6, the students shall require to study 4 papers of SEC, one in each semester, respectively. Each paper carries 4 credits making a total of 16 credits. Of these 2 papers, the students shall study English as mandatory in the Sem 3. The other 3 SEC papers will be decided by the department/ college as per the GU syllabus.

In Sem 5 and Sem 6, the student shall required to study 6 papers as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), with 3 papers in each semester. The DSE papers will be according to the syllabus of the GU. Each paper carries 6 credit. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree regular programme (non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only



## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE B.A./B.COM REGULAR COURSES UNDER CBCS

A student opting for undergraduate regular courses in B.A/B.Com (without honours )shall require to study 12 core papers. Out of these 12 papers, 8 core papers are in 2 disciplines (Each disciplines has 4 core papers). The Sem1, Sem 2, Sem 3 & Sem 4 has 1 core paper of each disciplines with 6 credits in each paper. The students shall required to study 2 papers on English. Eng-1 in Sem1 and Eng-2 in Sem 2. The remaining 2 core paper comprises of MIL/ALT Eng in Sem3 and Sem4.

The students shall require to study **English/ MIL communication and Environmental Science** as **AECC**, which consist of 2 papers, one each in Sem 1 & Sem 2, carrying 4 credits in each paper. The student has the choice to select one course for a particular semester.

In Sem 3, Sem 4, Sem 5 and Sem 6, the students shall required to study 4 papers of SEC, one in each semester, respectively. Each paper carries 4 credits making a total of 16 credits. The SEC papers will be decided by the department/ college as per the GU syllabus.

The student shall required to study **4 papers as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) in Sem 5 and Sem 6**, with 2 papers in each semester. The DSE papers will be according to the syllabus of the GU. Each paper carries 6 credits. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme (non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only







#### HONOURS AND REGULAR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES IN THE COLLEGE:

#### HONOURS SUBJECT IN UNDERGRADUATE ARTS STREAM:

The student opting honours in Arts stream may opt for any one of the subject listed below:

Assamese (total seat: 50), Anthropology (total seat: 20), Bodo (total seat: 30), Economics (total seat: 30), Education (total seat: 40), English (total seat: 20), Geography (total seat: 25), History (total seat: 10), Mathematics (total seat: 10). Philosophy (total seat: 25) and Political Science (total seat: 40)

#### REGULAR NON-HONOURS SUBJECT IN UNDERGRADUATE ARTS STREAM

The students opting to pursue regular non-honours course in Arts must select any two disciplines from the list of the subject given below:

Every student who has taken admission in Honours program has to take one Generic Elective (GE) paper besides the Core papers in the First Semester.

Students, who have taken admission, while confirming their seat with Parent Department, have to fill and submit the GE Allocation Form at the time of admission.

Generic Elective Application form, along with General Elective Choices, Paper Names and number of seats will be made available.

Guidance and Counselling for GE choices will be provided by the respective Parent Departments.



#### **SECTION: B**

#### I. Eligibility and Admission Procedure:

- The college follows relevant guidelines and regulations of affiliating authorities like GU, AHSEC etc regarding eligibility and minimum qualification for enrolment in any courses.
- 2. Admission is strictly on the basis of merit.
- 3. Aspiring students may apply for admission in Dudhnoi College through online portal by filling up requisite forms and paying the prescribed application fee.
- 4. The students will then have to appear for selection interview, on prescribed date, time and place, along with all necessary testimonials in original.
- 5. The admission process of the selected students will be over only after payment of all required fee through any of available online payment method.
- 6. Students whose parents' total annual income are less than 1 lakh rupees are admitted under the Assam Government's Fee waiver scheme. Students seeking admission under this scheme must produce parents' original income certificate issued by competent authority at the time of selection interview (certificate should not be more than one year old).
- 7. During the admission, the College will follow the relevant Government Rules and Regulations regarding reservation.
- 8. All payments to the college are strictly cashless.
- 9. The decision of the Admission Committee is final and binding in case of selection and admission of a student.
- 10. Students migrating from other universities and Boards must produce migration certificate and pay migration fee as per rule.

#### II. Change of Subject:

Admitted Students may change their combination of subjects within one month from the date of admission. However such changes are subjected to availability of seat and approval of concerned departmental HoD and Admission Committee. No change of combination of subject is allowed after one month from the date of admission.



#### III. Attendance:

Attendance in Higher Secondary classes (both theory and practical) is compulsory. Students with less than 75% attendance will be dis-collegiated and will be barred from appearing in the Board examination as regular students.

In Undergraduate Degree courses, the student must earn full credit in Core Courses, Generic Elective Courses (GE), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) [comprising of Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) & Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) for which the students should have minimum 75% attendance. Attendance means attending direct instruction hours, i.e., theory classes, seminars, workshops, practical, internships, educational trips, field works, project works etc.

IV. Basis for calculation of attendance: The basis for the calculation of the attendance hall be the number of hours of contact prescribed by the University. In case a student fails to have at least 75 percent attendance, he/she will not be allowed to sit for the end semester examination and hence have to repeat the concerned semester after the successful completion of the subsequent semesters.

#### V. Evaluation Process:

To make evaluation an integral part of teaching-learning process, Dudhnoi College adopted the process of continuous evaluation of students. Therefore taking all the sessional and internal examinations is mandatory for all students. Non-compliance will lead to discollegiation. For undergraduate degree students evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

- Internal Assessment (IA)
- End Semester Examination (ESE)

For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

**Internal Assessment (IA):** IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measures will be adopted for distributing marks earmarked for IA.







Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper. The 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:

- a) Class attendance from 76% to 80%...... 1 mark;
- b) Class attendance from 81% to 85%...... 2 marks;
- c) Class attendance from 86% to 90%...... 3 marks;
- d) Class attendance from 91% and above...... 4 marks.

Rest 30% of the marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:

- a) Home assignments, b) Seminar/Group discussions, c) Field work and
- e) Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

#### **End Semester Examination (ESE):**

The ESE will comprise of 80% of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

#### Pass Marks:

The pass marks will be as follows:

Theory paper: 30% Practical paper: 40%

The following rules will apply for the Bachelor Degree in any subject with Honours.

- Simple pass: 30% to 39% marks in aggregate, i.e., from CGPA 4.00 to less than CGPA 5.00
- Pass with Honours:" 40% marks or above in aggregate in Honours subjects, i.e., minimum of CGPA 5.00.
- In case a student with Honours in any subject secures less than 40% marks in aggregate (i.e. CGPA less than 5.00) but 30% or above in the







Honours subject, she/he shall be declared 'Simple Pass'.

• In case of project work or dissertation, it shall be a separate paper with separately allotted marks and cannot be treated as part of any other theory paper. Pass mark for project work or dissertation will be 50%.

#### **Number of Attempts**

A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester, irrespective of the number of papers in which she/he failed. In order to complete an UG degree, a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers prescribed. A student having failed to fill in his examination form in the first semester may be allowed to appear in the second semester if all other eligibility criteria are fulfilled.

#### VI. College Uniform:

Dudhnoi College Students' Union has adopted a uniform for the students of the college. The boy's uniform is black long formal pant and sky-blue shirt. The girl's uniform is white patiala pant and sky-blue kurta with white dupatta (leggings not allowed).

Wearing of uniform is mandatory for students within college campus and related academic activities.

VII. Anti Ragging Rule: The College is very strict against any kind of ragging. The antiragging committee of the college looks into the matter and strict actions is taken against anyone involved and indulge ragging.



#### VIII. Dudhnoi College Library Rules:

- 1. Admission to the Library: All members of the Dudhnoi College and also any other person with prior permission from the Librarian/administration may enter the library. The right of admission shall be denied to a mentally unsound or an intoxicated person.
- 2. Entrance inside the library: Before entering/leaving the library, one shall:
  - (a) Sign a visitor's register, thereby agreeing to abide by the rule and regulations of the library.
  - (b) Personal belongings such as bag, umbrella, file, personal books, etc. are not allowed inside library.
  - (c) Security personal will have the right to check visitors.
- 3. Membership: Membership of Dudhnoi College Library is granted by default to all faculty members, regular students and employees of Dudhnoi College.

However as a special case, temporary membership may be granted to someone by the library-in-charge on written request for so.

- **4. Hours of Library:** Library will remain open in all working days from 10:00 am to 5.00 pm. Book transaction can be done from 10.30 am to 4.30 pm.
- 5. Rules of Lending of Books:
  - (a) Books will be loaned to the registered members only.
  - (b) Students must produce his/her library Card for book transaction.
  - (d) Membership of a student shall remain valid for whole semesters of the course.
  - (e) The library staff may recall any book from member at any time.
  - (f) A book issued to someone can be reserved by others. That book will be issued next to the reserver in priority 1.
  - (g) A student or non-teaching staff member may take 2 books for 15 days at a time. A faculty member may take 5 books for 40 days at a time. Any member may re-issue a book for one more term only.
- 7. Overdue Fine: If book is not returned within the due date by any member, then a fine of INR 1.00 per book per day will be charged.
- 8. Loss or Damage of Borrowed Books: If a book is lost or damaged by the borrower than he/she shall be liable to replace the book. If the replacement is not done within 15 days, the defaulter will be charged three times the cost of the book if the book is in print and four times the cost of the book if the book is out of print.

#### 9. General Rules:

- a. All kinds of personal belongings except notebook and pen are to be kept in the property counter at the entrance.
- b. Silence must be maintained inside the library.
- |c. Mobile phone in silent/vibration mode only is permissible.
- d. Edibles are strictly prohibited inside the library except drinking water.
- e. Member shall not smoke or spit in any part of the library.
- f. Books once picked out from the stack should be left in the reading table if not issued out.



- g. The physical condition of the book should be checked while checking out. Mutilation of pages if found is to be brought to the notice of the circulation in-charge. Otherwise, the borrower himself/herself shall be responsible for mutilation of the book if detected afterwards.
- h. Underlining, writing, marking, folding of pages, etc. in the book is strictly prohibited.
- i. Members shall loss membership of the library for violation of library rules.
- j. The library in-charge-reserves the right to suspend membership of any member.
- k. The members caught tearing of pages/stealing books or otherwise mutilating books will be suspended forthwith from using library facilities and further disciplinary action will be initiated against him/her by authority, Dudhnoi College.

#### IX. Awards and Scholarships:

Besides various Central and State Government Awards and Scholarships, College also offers the following awards and scholarships:

- > Free studentship for one year is awarded to the student securing first position in:
  - 1. Higher Secondary First year securing more than 90% marks in qualifying examination.
  - 2. Higher Secondary Second year Student securing more than 80% marks in qualifying examination.
  - 3. TDC first, third and fifth semester Student securing more than 80% marks in qualifying examination.
- Hakim Chandra Rabha Memorial award is awarded to the best singer of the college selected in the annual college week.
- A cash award of Rs 5000.00 is also awarded to the best singer of the college. This award is sponsored by Ms. Minoti Sarma, retired HoD, Department of Philosophy, Dudhnoi College.

- i. Dudhnoi College Teachers' Association (DCTA): Formed by the faculty members of Dudhnoi College, the association is actively working for the betterment of the teaching community of the college in particular and the college in general. Affiliated to All Assam College Teachers' Association (ACTA), the association also take active part in various socio-cultural activities of the locality.
- ii. Women cell: The College has a women cell that looks after and works for cause of women.
- iii. Students Grievance and Redress Cell: The Students Grievance and Redress Cell works for mitigating various grievances of our students.
- iv. Anti Ragging Cell: The Anti Ragging Cell for the eradication of the ragging menace in the College.
- v. Anti Sexual Harassment Cell: The Anti Sexual Harassment Cell looks after sexual harassment related complains and maintain a healthy working condition in the College.



**Dudhnoi College Students' Union (DCSU):** it is the union of students of Dudhnoi College. Office bearers are selected for one year by the students through secret ballot. Election is conducted by the Dudhnoi College Election Commission specially constituted for the purpose. The union works for the all round development of student community in particular and the college as a whole. Besides organizing Annual College week and Freshmen Social, the DCSU publishes the Annual College Magazine and Wall Magazine.

- vii. National Service Scheme (NSS): College has a wing of National Service Scheme. The wing take up various social and community service activity in the locality to inculcate social responsibility and awareness among students.
- viii. Dudhnoi College Extension Education Cell: Dudhnoi College Extension Education Cell takes the resources of the College to the society. In the process it also collect feedback about socio-cultural realities of the society, so that those are reflect in the curriculum design and development of higher education.
- ix. Assam Science Society, Dudhnoi Branch: Assam Science Society, Dudhnoi Branch was established in the College by the initiatives of some faculty member along with students and local people. 
